



Olubadan Demands Judicial Overhaul As Olanipekun Charges Him On Unity Among Yoruba Monarchs

"Ibadan remains the political capital of Yorubaland. We can't change history, and with your unique pedigree as a former senator and governor, you are clearly a leader, and it is not by accident that you are here now," he added.

Oba Ladoja reiterated his commitment to use his position to serve the people of lbadanland. He said that whenever he reflected on his life and past travails, he was convinced that the Almighty had spared his life up to this moment and put him on the throne to serve the people of lbadanland.

"When I look at how and ask why God has preserved me till 81, it means He has a purpose for me, to be a servant of the Ibadan people. I am not afraid of hard work. I have said it before that I do not even mind being a councilor. And now that I have the role of leading Ibadan, my job is to harness all the resources and people, both indigenes and residents, including those who have passed through the city in one way or the other, for its growth," the monarch said.

To this end, he stated that the Economic and Investment Committee he constituted was aimed at freeing the native administration from hopeless dependence and from being an appendage of any government, in order to pursue developmental initiatives.
